7. Secretary Review of Year

Junior tennis

Looked at actions from last year's meeting where the emphasis on junior tennis meant that additional Saturday afternoon sessions were added. These did not meet everyone's expectations but they have now settled down into a very useful part of the overall programme with approximately 25 juniors attending. It also means our junior programme runs from 9am to 7pm on Saturdays. The additional sessions during the summer holiday and October half terms were also discussed and the parents present said they were a valuable addition. One of the parents said that it was the streaming of the children that the additional sessions allowed that was so beneficial.

Umran Ali highlighted some of the issues around having a performance strand at the club and trying to juggle the courts, financial and other constraints. He emphasised that, unlike a lot of academies, we are developing children from the start and not just training already strong players. The commitment of many parents had meant that the gap with the academies was often minimal. It was not the case that the academy structure was the only way to improve players. He felt that the achievements over the last 8 years were substantial.

We discussed the need for having a 'conveyor belt' type approach with the older players continuing to develop but with a continual need to bring along younger children behind them.

The second item discussed was the facilities at Burgess Park.

Last year's AGM mentioned the need to use the consultation process to push the case for covered courts. This lobbying was successful in pushing tennis to very near the top of the requested items for the park as a whole and the top requested sports project. However, none of the allocated £2.8 million budget for sports in the park from the Council is likely to go to tennis. Instead a request for £200,000 has been made to the LTA to fund the resurfacing of the existing courts and alterations to the building.

The achievements of Be Active and Southwark City Tennis Club are not being given enough weight. There was also an issue about some of the Council's assertions around tennis participation (that almost 10,000 people per annum used the 2 courts at Southwark Park). These figures are overestimates and it means that the relative impact of our work and future proposals is being grossly underestimated. It was agreed that we would challenge this and one member has already written to ask for the source of this under a Freedom of Information Request. Meetings with the LTA on 25 November and then with Councillor Hargrove should hopefully give us an opportunity to put our case.

Any Other Business

How to get access to concessional courts during the week – the 5-7pm slots are very busy Monday to Friday and it is really hard to get a court. The impact is especially significant on concessions as the higher price starts at 7pm. Availability is limited due to the loss of court 7 without floodlights, the junior programme and regular users (mostly juniors) booking the courts very quickly. A parent pointed out that the juniors faced similar constraints to many adults and couldn't use the courts before 4pm. Tom Ulicsak, on behalf of Be Active, said that they try to operate a first come, first served policy and that it did show the need for additional capacity at Burgess Park.

Amanda Lynn as Chairperson thanked all the volunteers and especially Anjum for doing a great job on the Big Lunch event and Becca Beach stepping down as a Trustee. Amanda as well as continuing to chair the junior committee meetings set out her 2016 priorities as being:

- 1) To build better relationship with Southwark Council.
 - 2) To promote womens tennis
 - 3) To make better use of social media and other channels to improve the standing of the club.

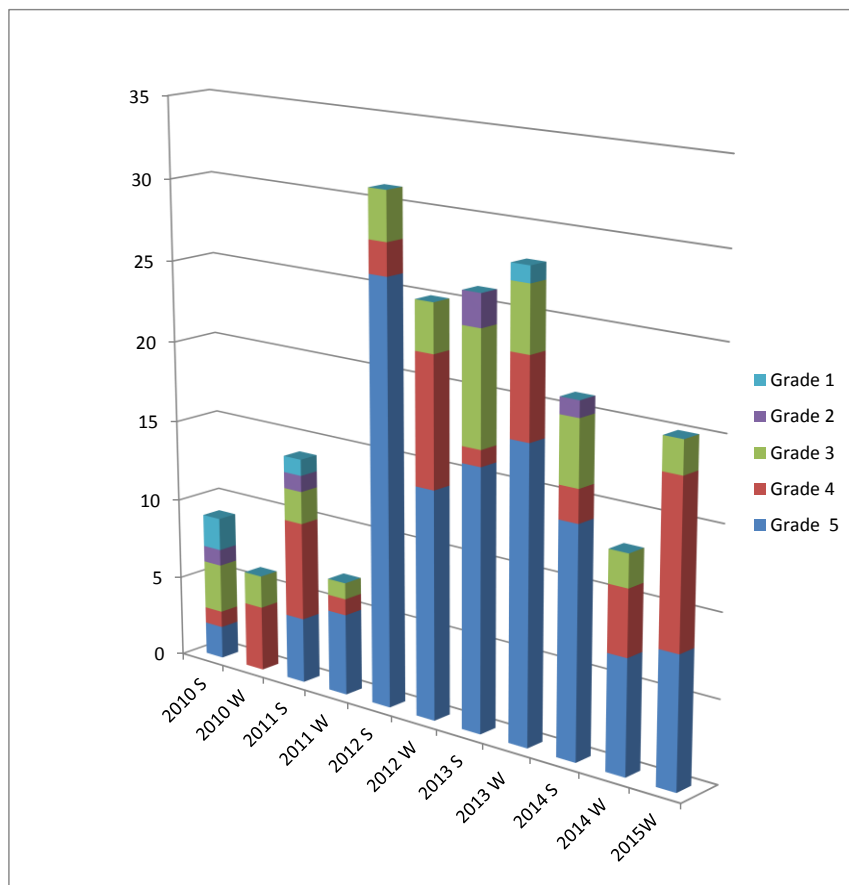
Appendix 2: Secretary Review of the Year

The following activities were undertaken by Southwark City Tennis Club and Be Active.

Junior Tennis April 2014 to March 2015

- At 30 September 2014 some 310 juniors being trained weekly split as follows Burgess Park (175), GMH Park (46), Tanner St Park (28), Salmon Centre (30), Bradfield (20), Girls satellite at GMH Park (10).
- From 27/09/14 Abdul Hassan is leading 5 new performance sessions on Saturday afternoons.
- Summer 2014 seven teams in Aegon Surrey Leagues with two titles for Girls and Boys 18U. A record number of 45 junior players represented us.
- Club hosted 22 LTA tournaments Summer 2014
- 2014 Launched six week Satellite Girls only tennis session at GMH Park on Mondays with Rushan Tonge-Bobia as the coach.
- Mukhtar Andu represented GB in Boys 11U matches in November in Roehampton in France. He also won a national level 11U tournament in France during the February visit to Paris.

- April to July Aegon Team Tennis wins for 10U mixed. Also RU U10 mixed and 2 red teams. Unfortunately we could not get captains and transport for the older age groups.
- Surrey 10U team award at All England Club (Sat 10 October 2015), Shiv, Joshua U, Augustine and Matthew. MJ was the individual award girls 14U player of the year.

Junior Tournament Wins



In the 2014/5 winter season 8 children won 13 events and in summer 2015 10 children won 20 titles.

LTA has 7 grades of competition. Grade 6&7 is internal club events. Grade 5 is local tournaments. 3&4 are regional and county level. Grades 1&2 are national level events. Summer = April to August.

From September 2015 we will be running 22 Grade 5 tournaments. This is likely to give our players more opportunities to compete.

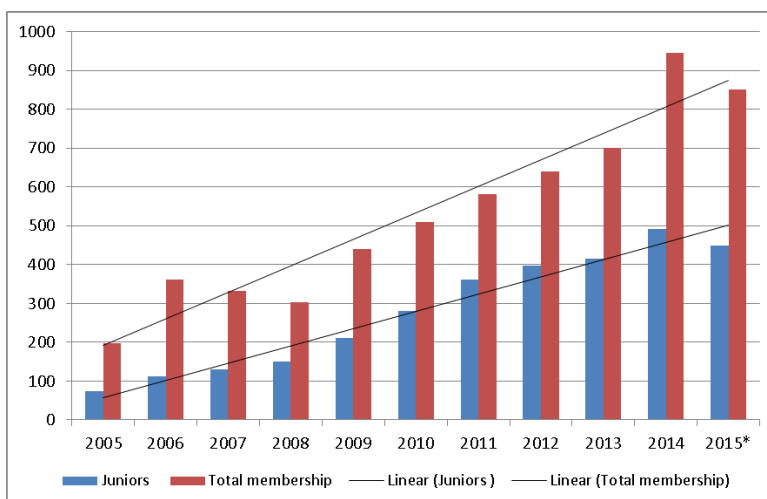
